

The cost of \$1245 per person includes 7 nights at Mullaway, 12 dives with Dive Quest, tanks/ weights/airfills, return airport transfers (if required). Use your frequent flyers, arrange your own flights or take your car. Indicative return airfare costs – Qantas \$504 or Virgin Blue \$418 (per internet search 28/07/13). The cost for



non diving partners is \$250. It will be a fun time full of diving and underwater photography at the Solitary Islands located north of Coffs Harbour. For those who have not dived here before, you will be pleasantly surprised by the diversity of diving around the five islands located within the Solitary Islands Marine Park. The Northern Solitary Islands in particular boast excellent subtropical diving, with approximately 80 different types of hard corals, soft corals and abundant tropical and pelagic fish life. In summer see Manta Rays and Spotted Eagle Rays and in winter Grey Nurse Sharks,



Giant Australian Cuttlefish and of course many opportunities of encounters with playful Humpback Whales and friendly pods of Dolphins. Humpback whales migration north and then south starts in June and completes in November. A spectacular feature of North Solitary Island is it's extensive Clown Fish and Anemone beds which carpet the floors of many dive sites. You will also have the pleasure of encountering many beautiful species of marine life, including Turtles, Spanish Dancers, many colorful tropical fish and much more. These islands provide fantastic opportunities for underwater photographers and divers to all levels of certification will find the diversity of marine and bottom life unique and



astounding. The many dive sites located around the Northern Solitaries provide endless opportunities to encounter new and exciting marine creatures on every dive making the holiday a memorable experience.
