The cost of \$990 per person includes 7 nights at Mullaway, 12 dives with Dive Quest, tanks/weights/airfills, return airport transfers (if required). Use your frequent flyers, arrange your own flights or take your car. Indicative return airfare costs – Qantas \$524 or Virgin Blue \$328 (per internet search 4/8/14). The cost for non diving partners is \$250.



It will be a fun time full of diving and underwater photography at the Solitary Islands located north of Coffs Harbour. For those who have not dived here before, you will be pleasantly surprised by the diversity of diving around the five islands located within the Solitary Islands Marine Park. The Northern Solitary Islands in particular boast excellent subtropical diving, with approximately 80 different types of hard corals, soft corals and abundant tropical and pelagic fish life



Expect to see Manta Rays, Spotted Eagle Rays and Grey Nurse Sharks.
